- **Commander Ray** stated he is trying to contact the leader of the local **Scouting America** organization to form a supportive partnership with Scouting America, though he is having some difficulty in accomplishing this. If anyone has a POC for the local Scouting America organization please contact the Commander or any Post Officer.
  - \* The Boy Scouts of America are changing their name to Scouting America effective February 8, 2025, to reflect a more inclusive commitment to welcoming all youth and families.
- Special thanks to Commander Ray for donating a box of newly purchased shirts to the Veterans of the Southwestern Veterans Center in East Liberty, a state facility that houses Veterans in need and their spouses or surviving widows. Special thanks to 1st Vice Commander John Dillon, Board Member John Caligiure and ALA Member Susan Dillon for volunteering to work at Operation Troop Appreciation.
- ◆ <u>Discussion</u>: The meeting entered into an open floor discussion as to which schools, youth programs and communities Post 712 should focus on supporting and sponsoring. By consensus of those present a decision was made to focus on those youth groups and schools in grades K thru 12 that are within the geographic area of Post 712. As school districts such as West Jefferson Hills and South Park are organically located within the geographic area of Post 712, the membership is open to actively supporting these entities. If a request is received from an external school, such as Baldwin (Nix Vogel Post 935), Clairton (Post 75), or Bethel Park (Post 760) for example, those requestors should be initially directed to American Legion Posts supporting those communities.

Post 712 will prioritize support to local communities using the same geographic guidelines. Therefore **Pleasant Hills, Jefferson Hills, West Elizabeth, and South Park** are organic to Post 712. It was further noted requests inconsistent with these guidelines will be re viewed by the membership on an as-needed basis.

The membership agreed in principle to maintain active support for **American Legion Post 490 Castle Shannon and VFW Post 1810 Brentwood as our partners** for hosting meetings, for welcoming Post 712 members to social events, for supporting the Post 712 Riders and for our ongoing mutually beneficial relationship with each entity.

# SOMEONE YOU SHOULD KNOW— John Dillon — "Top"



Many of us know **John Dillon, or "Top"**, as the First Vice Commander of Post 712 and the Director of the Legion Riders. However, there is more to the story for this **25-year Army Veteran**. John enlisted in the Army Reserves as a junior at *Keystone Oaks HS* and began drilling as a **Combat Engineer** with the *420<sup>th</sup> Combat Engineer Company* in East Liberty while attending high school and college. After 5 years in the Army Reserve, he transferred to the Regular Army and began his active-duty career where he served an additional 20 years as an **Infantryman and a CID Special Agent** (CID = U.S. Army Criminal Investigation Command). As an Infantryman, Top served as a Squad Leader and a Sniper among other duties. As a CID Special Agent, he held an array of positions including Special Agent-in-Charge, Violent Crimes Team Chief and Battalion First Sergeant.

During his career Top was assigned to numerous locations across the globe including *Korea, Germany, Fort Campbell, KY, Fort Moore (Benning), GA, Fort Knox, KY, and Fort Riley, KS*. He deployed or was assigned temporary duty to many far-flung locations including the Middle East, The United Kingdom, Portugal, the Netherlands, Bulgaria, Israel, and Russia.

When asked his favorite assignment Top will answer that it is a toss-up between the 3 years he served as a **Special Agent-in-Charge of the Augsburg (Germany) CID Resident Agency** where he led a wide array of investigations working with an international community of law enforcement professionals or the **3 years he served as the CID Battalion First Sergeant at Fort Riley, KS**, Home of the Big Red One, where he led all matters involving Non-

Commissioned Officers and Enlisted Service Members within the Battalion.

This last assignment, as a Battalion First Sergeant, is where John garnered his nickname, "Top"; as the traditional Army nickname for the Senior Non-Commissioned Officer of the Company or Battalion.

Top attended many training courses during his career such as the *Sniper Course* and the *Edged Weapons Course*, though especially courses in law enforcement. He is *certified* as a *Hostage Negotiator* and an Advanced *Fraud Investigator*, along with having trained and worked in Drug Suppression, Gang and Extremist Group Suppression, and Protective Services Activity (bodyguard to the Secretary of Defense and the Chairman of the Joint Chief of Staff).



Though one of his toughest courses wasn't even a Military course. He was selected as one of two U.S. Special Agents to attend the, **Sherlock Holmes Course**, or as it is more formally known, the Advanced Crime Scene Management and Investigations Course of New Scotland Yard. The course was conducted at the Metropolitan Police Academy in *London, England* and was a challenge though provided Top with investigative techniques and observation skills he used throughout his career in furtherance of investigative excellence.

Top is very proud of the Army and its Soldiers and believes in the Army moniker Soldier for Life. In 1990, he was selected as the CID Special Agent of the Year and of his decorations he is especially proud of the Outstanding Volunteer Service Medal for which he was recognized for volunteer service helping youth in the Military Community. His other awards include the Bronze Star, The Meritorious Service Medal (4) and the Army Commendation Medal (3).

#### **New Secretary of Defense—The Honorable Pet Hegseth**

The Honorable Pete Hegseth is the 29th Secretary of Defense, sworn in on Jan. 25, 2025.

Hon. Hegseth was commissioned as an Infantry Officer in the U.S. Army National Guard after graduating from Princeton University in 2003. He participated in a number of active-duty deployments during his time in service, including operations in Guantanamo Bay, Iraq and Afghanistan. Hegseth also served in multiple staff positions in the National Guard.

#### New Secretary of Defense—The Honorable Pet Hegseth continued

Hegseth's military awards include two Bronze Star Medals, the Joint Commendation Medal, two Army Commendation Medals, the Combat Infantryman Badge (CIB) and the Expert Infantryman Badge (EIB). He has authored five books, including the *New York Times* best-seller *The* 

War on Warriors (2024).

"When President Trump chose me for this position, the primary charge he gave me was to bring the warrior culture back to the DoD," Hegseth said during his confirmation hearing before the Senate Armed Services Committee."

He, like me, wants a Pentagon laser-focused on lethality, meritocracy, warfighting, accountability and readiness."



Hegseth listed restoring the warrior ethos, rebuilding the military and reestablishing deterrence as the ingredients needed to bring back warfighting.

Calling himself a change agent, Hegseth outlined a vision of a culture of accountability, high standards, performance, readiness, rapid innovation and merit across the Defense Department.

"We share the same goals," he told the committee. "A ready, lethal military; the health and well-being of our troops; and a strong and secure America."

He also said he would trim the bureaucracy and reallocate resources to the warfighter. "We won World War II with seven four-star generals," he said. "Today we have 44. ... There is an inverse relationship between the size of staffs and victory on the battlefield. We do not need more bureaucracy at the top. We need more warfighters empowered at the bottom. So, it is going to be my job ... to identify those places where fat can be cut, so it can go toward lethality."

A former Army National Guard officer, Hegseth, 44, served as an infantryman leading troops in Iraq and Afghanistan and guarding detainees at Guantanamo Bay. His military awards include two Bronze Star Medals, the Joint Commendation Medal, two Army Commendation Medals, the Combat Infantryman Badge and the Expert Infantryman Badge.

Hegseth said his role as the 29th secretary of defense is "the most important deployment of my life."

Hailing from Minnesota, Hegseth graduated from Princeton University in 2003 and earned a master's degree from Harvard University in 2013. He has led organizations advocating for veterans, served as a Fox News host and published several books. Hegseth and his wife, Jennifer, have seven children.
