We have made tremendous progress and success during my tenure as commander which I will briefly explain as I go along. While our internal projects are important we must never forget that we must adhere to the core competincies of the national legion charter. After all if there is no legion none of us will be here. The legion is built on four pillars.

Pillar One: Veteran Affairs, **Pillar Two:** Security. **Pillar Three:** Americanism, **Pillar Four:** Children & Youth Activity's. Each of these pillars have many sub-divisions and I purposely steered our legion not only to meet these requirements but to far exceed them. Our endenavors not only made the district attention but section and national as well. One of our events made it all the way to the Pennsylvania Senate!

Just to name a few, were a complete streamlining of our membership process. When I began my tenure, potential members complained that it took months to receive their membership cards and now they receive them almost immediately. Another area I dealt with were the annual dues of our regular members, the ALA and SONS. I believed that some paid too much so I leveled the playing field and now we all pay the same amount. Our constant membership drive was all over the map when I began and Linda completely revamped the process and we attained 100% completion in our first year, very rare with a post of our size. Our Community Awareness Projects were also a huge success. We collaborated with numerous Eagle Scout projects both here at the post as well as local cemeteries. Operation Helping Hero's was just another of our huge successes. As you know we teamed up with the West Jefferson Hills PTA and Elementary School in order to help our veterans at the Southwestern VA Center while creating Operation Helping Hero's. When the smoke cleared we delivered a van full of supplies that carried the VA Center through the winter. While it is honorable to give to various veteran agency's we must never forget our own veteran's. There are many programs out there most of which will never benefit our own veteran's as they will never qualify. I have always been a proponent that charity begins at home. Another milestone was our Oratorical Achievement Award which we awarded in the Thomas

HOW TO GET A COPY OF YOUR DD214

Although it is best to have a copy of your service member's DD214 in a safe place where it can be located at the time of his or her death, here is information you can follow in the event you need an emergency DD214.

For emergency DD214 requests for funerals:

- 1. Call 314-801-0800 and explain you need a DD214 for a funeral service.
- 2. Call Department of Veterans Affairs, Pittsburgh, PA Veteran Benefits: for funerals: 800-827-1000. You will need the veteran's social security number.

For assistance, call: Post Adjutant 412-512-1301.


