From the Desk of the Adjutant

We at the Legion ran into several unusual problems costing several thousands of dollars the past couple of months that we were not expecting. I suspect that some of you may have had situations along similar lines.

First: We had our AC maintenance vendor come out to do routine preventive maintenance on our rooftop AC units to prepare for summer usage. We assumed that they may need to replace belts etc. They found extensive damage to multiple motors and squirrel cage fans on 2 units.

Second: One of our bar TVs was intermittently losing color. We suspected loose cables on the back of the cable box because the color would come back occasionally when someone was moving them. It turned out that the TV was defective. Since the lower cost of new TVs make repairing old ones uneconomical, we upgraded the main TV and the side TV with larger units. Because one of the old TVs was still usable, we redeployed it in the Social Hall for use by those renting it for family events to display family pictures, home movies etc., or to display spread sheets, Power Point presentations, movies etc. for business meetings or for stuff like Bingo Display boards for fund raisers etc.

Third: We had a major problem with our 2 office PCs running out of hard drive space. The free space was continuing to go down for no apparent reason, even when no applications were running. It eventually got down to zero free space available. We deleted old files and used Windows cleanup programs to free up space, but that soon disappeared also. We suspected malware, but we're running antivirus and use these PCs for paying bills, membership and controlling key cards, not to surf the web. When we first did a check of all main directories and added up all the usage, we came up with less than 100 GB used on a 500 GB hard drive. We were missing over 400 GB of space. We went back and did a more detailed check of sub-directories and found some that would say you don't have permission to look at them,

but would give you the option to turn on access if you were logged is as an administrator. We looked at over 50 sub-directories and turned on access to any that were initially not viewable. When we turned on permission to view the '\Windows\ Temp' directory, we discovered the missing 400 GB of space. We deleted all the files in '\Windows\Temp' directory and got our free space back. A check on the web shows a problem with Windows 7 that can cause it to create log files with names like 'cab xxxx'. I would like to give a shout out to Paul McQuade, who created our Legion web site, for his assistance in resolving our problem. Paul is investigating the reason for the creation of the log files.


