Spring has sprung and yet as I craft this article I am looking out the window at freezing temperatures and snow flurries. Very sad! Now some of my Brothers and Sisters will ride their bikes with temperatures in the 30's and snow or sleet in the forecast; these hearty troubadours are renown as we often see a baby-blue Trike zipping through the South Hills in all manner of weather. The steely eyed Veteran easily navigating the perils of winter riding. These hard core Riders are to be appreciated for their commitment to the open road and a lifestyle of freedom ... but I'm not one of them. I like the temperature in the 60's and the sky's clear when I ride. And let's not even talk about the potholes, collapsing road shoulders, dead animals, salt, car parts and other debris on the

roads following winter. So my bike stays on the battery tender for at least one more week.

On a more humbling note, what does Memorial Day mean to you? Maybe before answering this question we should review what Memorial Day is supposed to mean to our Nation. Memorial Day is a National holiday observed on the last Monday of May, honoring the men and women who died while serving in the U.S. Military. Memorial Day originated following the Civil War but did not officially become Memorial Day until 1967 and was not an official federal holiday in 1971. The birthplace of Memorial Day is considered Waterloo, NY, where on May 5, 1866, the city honored local Veterans who fought in the Civil War. Memorial Day was originally called Decoration Day as Patriots displayed flowers, wreaths and flags on the graves of the fallen in honor and remembrance.
